

While sickness and appointments during school time are inevitable, parents are asked that absences are reduced as much as possible to ensure that every day counts. Each year I share the following table to highlight the fact that just a small amount of time away, over a child's schooling can make a big impact to their learning. Attendance is valued at Wallaville State School. Each week we award one student for their attendance at school. All students who attend school each day for the week, with no late arrivals or early departures go into the draw for a \$10 Scholastic book voucher. These vouchers are kindly donated by our P&C and we thank them for their continued commitment to supporting our students to achieve the best that they possibly can. All student absences need to be phoned into the office (as per the phone numbers at the bottom of this newsletter), or students signed in if late and out if departing early. 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One School. A 90% explained attendance rate is needed each term for students to attend Mega Star Rewards activities.














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
